The rapidity with which the beautifully produced bulletin of my report, "New Beginnings that Determine the End", given to the expanded REB 12/29/85, was forwarded to all locals, creates the opportunity for you to see how very different from any classes we have ever held are these Workshop/Classes, scheduled to begin in mid-Feb.


Cutside of a very brief introduction on Methodology, (Just read the firth paragraph on page 4: "Methodology had us probe the process of a concretely developing situation which led-us to the phildSophic principles of being and nothing. This has nothing to do with the Sartrean expression of <u>Being and Nothingness</u>. Hegel's dialectic principle of being and nothing does not end with that announcement of those two opposites. The Hegelian dialectic pointed to being and nothing <u>BECCMING</u>." -- and you will get the essence of all that is left for you TO DO to repeat, outside of this introductory part, YCU YOUR-SELVES have to do all the work in all the classes. YOU have to grapple with what actually happened <u>objectively</u> as well as its <u>philosophic</u> significance, both inherent in itself, <u>and</u> in relationship to, as a measure of, Marxist-Humanism, specifically its revolutionary, journalistic expression. YOU will have to bring into class a very brief 2 page <u>write-up</u> for <u>News & Letters</u>, which may or may not print it. YCU yourself will have to learn how to <u>listen</u> when you consider the audience not a "them", but a part of your self, <u>working out</u>, <u>developing</u>, what you said and what were their comments <u>critically</u>--and out of that conclude for the future, perhaps making an essay of the event or point developed.

Part III of the Report (p. 16), "Return to the Beginning" isn't part of the classes. But it is the type of Retrospective that unfolds an actual Perspective because it does not alone have you grapple with the parallelism of 1953-55 and 1983-85. That parallelism was between the <u>birth</u> of Marxist-Humanism in the McCarthy Period, and Marxist-Humanism in the period of the Reagan Retrogression when we embarked on the Marx Centennary Tour, when we alread had accomplished a "trilogy of revolution" and had in hand RLWLAM, whose Chr 12 threw down the gauntlet to all post-Marx Marxists to return to <u>Marx's</u> Marxism, <u>not</u> Engels, <u>not</u> Lenin's, <u>not</u> Mao's, and thus to take on the task of concretizing Marx's Marxism for this <u>age</u>.

The Perspective thus becomes the new doors this period of Marxist-Humanism has opened on the Elack Dimension, on WL, on all activities as well as philosophically with Dialectics of Revolution, i.e. philosophic preparation for actual revolution. This is what led us tobur Perspectives for 1986, formulated in 1985 for a biweekly. Preparations for this developed in the new collectivities of worker-intellectual for trips Te Appalachia, to Mexico and with work among Latinos in the U.S.; in the Workshop/Classes in which the type of letter we received directly from South Africa showed a new relationship with international revolutionary forces.

Finally, the reason for this letter being addressed directly to the organizers is the work you have to do right now in preparation both for workshop/classes in February and the Financial Appeal which will appear in the <u>N&L</u> now going to press, and which will mean much needed follow-through by the organization as a whole, including for the <u>much expanded</u> new edition of <u>Frantz Fanon, Soweto and American Black</u>

No sooner was 12/29/85 expanded REB over and the New Y of 1986 greeted, than, on January 3, I wrote a special "Dear Sister-Comrades" Letter, which, of coase as always, meant not only for WL N&L; but for all, which includes non-members as well.
